*Un-embedded war reporting:
against the mainstream media current*



Reporting on military issues is a daily part of Canadian journalism. Whether it's the latest events in Fallujah, Iraq, a tragedy involving a Canadian submarine or the broader questions about Canadian military commitments abroad and at home, [Scott Taylor](#) has been covering military issues for Canadians for more than a decade.

Scott will share his views on journalistic coverage of the Canadian military and talk about his personal experiences as an independent war correspondent.

At the Canadian Association of Journalists National Writers' Symposium in Charlottetown last month, Scott's presentation as one of three keynote speakers, along with Linden MacIntyre of CBC's fifth estate and Pulitzer Prize winner Jacqui Banaszynski, was enthusiastically received.

Scott, a former professional soldier, has been editor and publisher of the Ottawa-based military issues magazine *Esprit de Corps* for the past 14 years.

He has logged over one million air miles as a war correspondent reporting from such global hot spots as the Persian Gulf, Cambodia, Western Sahara, Croatia, Bosnia, Kosovo and Macedonia.

Scott has made 20 trips to Iraq over the past four years. During his most recent visit there, in early September, he was held captive for five days.
